We welcomed Amanda Hukee (History and Sociology/Anthropology major, class of 2025) as our Library intern this semester, with Anna Hulseberg as site supervisor and Dan Mollner as faculty sponsor. Hukee's special project this semester was focused around the election.

For this project, Amanda documented the fall 2024 election season at Gustavus for the benefit of future researchers. Amanda worked with her internship supervisor (Anna Hulseberg), the College Archivist (Jeff

Jenson), and the Archives Collections & Records Manager (Adrianna Darden) to review historical materials on elections in the College Archives, collecting material such as articles, editorials, and letters published in the Gustavian Weekly and other news sources. She also reviewed flyers, announcements, and programs from election-related campus events, College resources and communications related to voting and the election season, campus photos (such as election-related sidewalk chalking), and more. In the end, Hukee will create a final report describing the gathered material; her process for collecting and organizing it; and her reflections on the project.


Giving to GLA Honors a Loved One in a Book!
